



2021/22 Heineken Champions Cup Pool Draw

The draw for the 2021/22 Heineken Champions Cup pools will take place in Lausanne on Wednesday 21 July at 12.00 UK/Irish time and will be live-streamed on HeinekenChampionsCup.com

The following are the key principles and key steps integral to the draw:

- The 24 clubs which have qualified on merit from the Gallagher Premiership, the PRO14 and the TOP 14 will compete in the 2021/22 Heineken Champions Cup in two pools of 12 Pool A and Pool B.
- The clubs are divided into four tiers based on their performances in the knockout phases of their respective leagues, and/or on their qualifying positions in their respective league tables, or on other qualification criteria, as follows:

Tier 1 (6 clubs): 1st and 2nd ranked clubs from each league Tier 2 (6 clubs): 3rd and 4th ranked clubs from each league Tier 3 (6 clubs): 5th and 6th ranked clubs from each league Tier 4 (6 clubs): 7th and 8th ranked clubs from each league

- Each pool will contain four clubs from each league one from Tier 1, one from Tier 2, one from Tier 3 and one from Tier 4.
- Clubs in the same tier from the same league cannot be in the same pool. Therefore, clubs in the same tier from the same league are either drawn into one of the two pools, or allocated to the remaining pool, so that this key principle will apply.
- For the purposes of creating the fixtures, clubs from the same league cannot play against one another during the pool stage, and clubs will only play against other clubs in the same pool.
- The Tier 1 clubs and the Tier 4 clubs which have been drawn in the same pool, but which are not from the same league, will play one another home and away over four pool stage rounds.
- The Tier 2 clubs and the Tier 3 clubs which have been drawn in the same pool, but which are not from the same league, will play one another home and away over four pool stage rounds.
- The fixture schedule with dates, venues, kick-off times and TV coverage will be announced as soon as possible.

Heineken Champions Cup qualification

For the purposes of creating the tiers, the TOP 14, Premiership and PRO14 clubs are ranked based on league performances and on knockout phase performances in their respective competitions. For clubs which did not qualify for the knockout phase, or which were eliminated at the same stage of the knockout phase, rankings are decided by league table finishing positions and/or by other official qualification criteria.

How the draw works

STEP 1

The Tier 1 clubs are the first to be drawn as follows:

The balls for the 1st and 2nd ranked TOP 14 clubs are put into the club drum and one club ball is drawn.

The Pool A and Pool B balls are put in into the pool drum and a pool ball is drawn.

The other TOP 14 club in Tier 1 then automatically goes into the remaining pool to ensure the key principles apply.

The process is repeated for the 1st and 2nd ranked Premiership and PRO14 clubs in Tier 1.

STEP 2

The Tier 4 clubs are next to be drawn.

The balls for the 7th and 8th ranked TOP 14 clubs in Tier 4 are put into the club drum and one club ball is drawn.

The Pool A and Pool B balls are put in into the pool drum and a pool ball is drawn.

The other TOP 14 club in Tier 4 then automatically goes into the remaining pool to ensure the key principles apply.

The process is repeated for the 7th and 8th ranked Premiership and PRO14 clubs in Tier 4.

STEP 3

The Tier 2 clubs are next to be drawn.

The balls for the 3rd and 4th ranked TOP 14 clubs in Tier 2 are put into the club drum and one club ball is drawn.

The Pool A and Pool B balls are put in into the pool drum and a pool ball is drawn.

The other TOP 14 club in Tier 2 then automatically goes into the remaining pool to ensure the key principles apply.

The process is repeated for the 3rd and 4th ranked Premiership and PRO14 clubs in Tier 2.

STEP 4

The Tier 3 clubs are the last to be drawn.

The balls for the 5th and 6th ranked TOP 14 clubs in Tier 3 are put into the club drum and one club ball is drawn.

The Pool A and Pool B balls are put in into the pool drum and a pool ball is drawn.

The other TOP 14 club in Tier 3 then automatically goes into the remaining pool to ensure the key principles apply.

The process is repeated for the 5th and 6th ranked Premiership and PR014 clubs in Tier 3.
